



# The Cathedral Parish of *St Francis Xavier* Adelaide 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Lent 29 March 2009



During last week we paused in our Lenten journey to celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation. This feast recalls for us the meeting which took place in an obscure village in a remote province of the Roman Empire some 2000 years ago. The meeting was between a young maiden and a messenger, come to her with a request from God. It was a meeting which was to change the course of history, both her history and our history. By being generously obedient to the request from God, Mary "became the cause of salvation for herself and for the whole human race." (St Irenaeus). In saying "Yes" to God, the Blessed Virgin became both our mother and our model in faith. We too are asked at times to give a generous "Yes" to God. Sometimes this is easy and at other times we can find this a little more challenging. But we know that God loves us and wants only our good, despite the fact that at times life seems confusing and complicated. For Mary too, there were questions and mysteries, but that didn't stop her from saying "Yes" to God. In this generosity she is our model.

In a few weeks we will commemorate another and greater and more generous "Yes" to God. That of course is Jesus' "Yes" to the Father. The "Yes" of the Cross. This act of generosity is one which we can only wonder at. It is beyond our human experience, yet we have all benefitted from it. Because of it we now have Jesus as our brother, God as our Father and Mary as our Mother.

As we resume our Lenten journey, let us ask Mary our mother to help us prepare to accompany Jesus' on his journey, the journey he undertook for love for us. Her "Yes" at the Annunciation began the process of our redemption, a process which reached its climax at the "Yes" of Calvary and the empty tomb. May this Lent find us also generous in saying "Yes" to whatever God may ask of us.

The schedule of all the ceremonies of Holy Week in the various churches of Cathedral parish is now available and has been published in the papers. These liturgies are full of joy, sorrow and glory. They speak to us in many and varied ways of God's love for each of us. Perhaps we may know someone who has drifted away from the Church, or who is interested in finding out more about our faith. Why not gently invite them to come to church this Easter? It may be just the invitation that they have been waiting for.

May God continue to bless us on our Lenten journey, a journey to the Cross, but also to the Resurrection.

## Did you know?

- In the gospels, Jesus often refers to himself as the Son of Man, a mysterious expression that both reveals and conceals his identity.
- The festival referred to here was the Passover (In 12:1). Observant Jews who were able came from far and wide to celebrate this great festival at the Temple in Jerusalem. The city was full of pilgrims from many lands and regions.
- The Passover is just one of the three great pilgrimage festivals of Judaism.

Lord, may I die to myself in Jesus so that through him I may have new life.

## Symbols and Images.

'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.' John uses the term 'the hour' to refer to the salvific death and exultation of Jesus. For the first time, in this story, Jesus proclaims that his hour has come. His death is imminent.
