Refugees: “hidden in the footsteps of Joseph and Mary” – Pope Francis.

In his Christmas Eve homily last year the Pope, who has made refugees a major plank of his papacy, tells us that refugees are God “...present in the unwelcomed visitor”. He concluded his homily with this prayer: “Moved by the joy of the gift, little Child of Bethlehem, we ask that your crying may shake us from our indifference and open our eyes to those who are suffering. May your tenderness awaken our sensitivity and recognize our call to see you in all those who arrive in our cities, in our histories, in our lives. May your revolutionary tenderness persuade us to feel our call to be agents of the hope and tenderness of our people.”

Those who wish to take up the Pope’s call to be agents of hope have an opportunity in our campaign to help our fellow parishioner, **Mahdi Rafee** (Antony), who joined our Church last Easter and now faces forced removal to Afghanistan and the real possibility of persecution and death. Open Doors International has just ranked Afghanistan as the second worst offender among those nations in which Christianity is persecuted. We are grateful for those who have already visited and written letters on his behalf but Pharaoh’s heart remains hard. 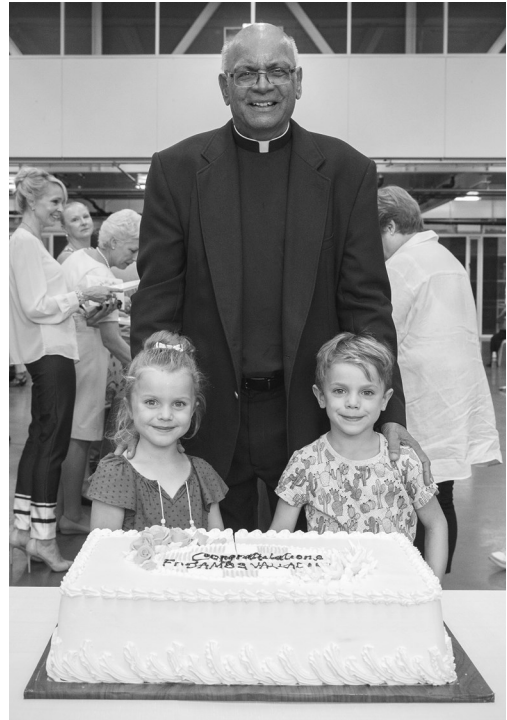
ST PAULS COLLEGE IS TURNING 60!
