LENT

VOLUNTEER BRIEFING

Over the years, we have become increasingly aware of our responsibility for child protection. As part of that commitment all volunteers have a legislated duty to report child abuse and neglect, this is called mandatory notification. To ensure we hear children's voices and have the necessary skills to identify and respond appropriately in these situations, we invite any volunteers who have not yet participated in Child Safe Environments training or an equivalent course to attend a 90 minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit.

The next local volunteer briefing will be held at the Sisters of St Joseph on Thu 22 Feb from 10.30am to 12pm in Bethany, 4 High St Kensington.

In accordance with Archdiocesan Policy, all Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are required to demonstrate certification of attendance at Child Safe Environments Training. Thank you for agreeing to help us provide care and safety for our children and young people. Please RSVP to childprotection@adelaide.catholic.org.au as this will help us to ensure you are provided with an information pack and certificate of attendance.

A PLEA TO THE MINISTER

Cathedral parishioner, Mohammed Mahdi Rafee, appealed on Wednesday to the Minister for Immigration and Border Control, Mr Peter Dutton, to intervene in his case. Rafee became a Catholic at the Cathedral last Easter Vigil. He is in immigration detention and fears he would be killed if he is deported to Afghanistan.

Rafee has asked to be allowed to lodge an application for a protection visa. An earlier request for ministerial intervention failed – but it did not mention Rafee's conversion to Christianity. This application is based on that "new information".

Last week's application speaks about the support our parish is giving to Rafee, which includes letters to the Minister from members of the parish. It mentions two letters from Archbishop Wilson. One was to confirm that he had baptised Rafee. The other was written after Rafee was taken into immigration detention. It also includes the front page story on Rafee in the current issue of The Southern Cross.

The application lodged last week on Rafee's behalf says he should be allowed to lodge his new claim in accordance with the Refugee Convention. It also details the history of Rafee's conversion, from reading the Bible to the first time he came to the Cathedral, his journey through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults program and his eventual baptism. It points out that the Catholic Church's path to baptism for adults is quite demanding.

Rafee's baptismal name is Antony.

Mr Dutton replied to Archbishop Wilson's letters this week. He provided a good deal of background information on policy, thanked the Archbishop for bringing his concerns to his attention and said he had referred the correspondence to Rafee's case manager for attention.
