The themes of the rally are peace, welcome and permanent protection. Approximately 30,000 refugees are in our community on temporary visas with their futures in limbo. Many families are separated by the harsh system, and people despair of ever being reunited. Many lack access to education and citizenship and fear being deported to danger, including our parishioner Mohammed Mahdi Rafee. This rally is supported by refugee groups in Adelaide.
