VOLUNTEER BRIEFING

Over the years, we have become increasingly aware of our responsibility for child protection. As part of that commitment all volunteers have a legislated duty to report child abuse and neglect, this is called mandatory notification. To ensure we hear children's voices and have the necessary skills to identify and respond appropriately in these situations, we invite any volunteers who have not yet participated in Child Safe Environments training or an equivalent course to attend a 90 minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit. Please choose from the following sessions on **Wednesday 21st March**:

10.30am to 12pm, St John the Baptist School, Plympton Anzac Highway (for the Plympton Parish)

or

6pm to 7.30pm, St Marys Hall, 19 High Street Glenelg (for the Glenelg Parish).

In accordance with Archdiocesan Policy, all Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are required to demonstrate certification of attendance at Child Safe Environments Training. Thank you for agreeing to help us provide care and safety for our children and young people.
