This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to the local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing. Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land rely on assistance from the Good Friday collection. The collection is also used to maintain 74 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus, visited by millions of Catholics every year. Archbishop Wilson has expressed his gratitude for your generous support of the places holy to our faith.

HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is a wonderful time of entering into the great mystery of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. I would encourage every one of us to find some time for prayer and reflection during this week. Also I recommend very strongly that we see the special Three Days as a bit of a package, one leading on to the other. I would encourage all of us to make a special effort to be present at Holy Thursday when we celebrate the Last Supper and the gift of the Eucharist and Jesus' command for us to follow his example of service to each other and to all. Also on Holy Thursday as we spend time in prayer and adoration after the Mass giving thanks for the gift of Jesus while also entering with Him into the experience of Gethsemane where despite his struggles he remained faithful to the will of God our Father. On Good Friday in the morning we have the Stations of the Cross where we walk with Jesus from his place of condemnation to his death and burial. In the afternoon, we have the major Service of Good Friday where we celebrate the Passion of Christ, pray for the needs of the Church and humanity and receive the Eucharist. The most important liturgy of the Church is the Easter Vigil where we move from the darkness of death into the victory of resurrection. A number of our brothers and sisters, catechumens and candidates join our church family through the sacraments of Initiation. We also are all invited to renew our baptism promises and commitment. The Easter Vigil is a beautiful and wonderful ceremony, and we are invited to make a special effort to be part of it if we can. The other Sunday Masses on Easter Day are also wonderful and beautiful celebrations of life and hope.

DULWICH/BURNSIDE SVDP CONFERENCE

The Dulwich/Burnside St Vincent de Paul conference recently packed 85 hospital "Annie" Packs: 75 for the Adelaide Catholic Aboriginal Centre and 10 for the SVDP Migrant and Refugee Centre. These toiletry and pyjama packs are distributed to people who come from the country in an emergency. The conference also gave the Migrant & Refugee Centre a large number of toiletries and nappies. These projects are carried out three times a year. They are only possible through the generous financial donations of parishioners.

The Dulwich Conference of St Vincent de Paul recently received a letter from its Twin Conference in Parkchong Thailand. Each year an amount of \$380 is forwarded to assist Parkchong in its work. They gave out rice and dried foods to local families at Christmas time and blankets as New Year's gifts. They are currently assisting two additional families and a bedridden patient's family for whom they have arranged all daily necessities. It is amazing how much assistance they are able to give with meagre funds.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

This year, the Divine Mercy Sunday celebrations will start at 1.30pm on Sunday 8 April at St Patrick's Church, Grote Street. We start with devotions, prayers and the sacrament of Reconciliation followed by Mass. All welcome.

CONVERSATIONAL ENGLISH PROGRAM

The organisers have decided to retire the above program for the time being. Since it began other programs have been started in and around the city and we are no longer attracting sufficient participants to justify it being continued. If this changes, we will be happy to start it up again. The parish commenced the Conversational English Program in March 2011. It was designed to meet a number of objectives, one of which was to assist the integration of overseas students into our parish community. Over nearly 8 years the program has engaged students, refugees, skilled migrants and others from Brazil, Sudan, Mexico, Indonesia, Colombia, Venezuela, Iran, Afghanistan, Vietnam, China, Malaysia, France, Poland, Japan, Korea, the Philippines and more. Over the time we have many volunteers who have stayed for various periods of time and three coordinators – Robbie Fernandez, Angela Honner and Jeanette Marszal who have given generously of their time and skill. We are very grateful to these coordinators and to the current team of enthusiastic and committed volunteers, MaryAnn Martin, John Crow, Warren Featherstone, Judy Knight and Glyn Davies.

LINEN COLLECTION THANK YOU

Many thanks for your extremely generous response to the Linen Collection for Moore Street Centre for the Homeless. Special thanks to the Cathedral and Dulwich/Burnside parishioners. We have cleared the boxes at these churches mid-week, as well as after the weekend Masses, because they have been overflowing. We have taken two large deliveries to Moore Street at the time of writing. Sister Janet Mead and her staff asked me to convey their heartfelt thanks for your amazing generosity. The Centre has over 35 houses around Adelaide for homeless persons. When residents are able to move to different accommodation, they take the household items they have been using to help them start in their next home, and the houses are replenished for the incoming residents. In addition the Centre also has a large garden at the rear of the Adelaide Gaol where they grow much of the food they serve every weekday and add to the food parcels they deliver regularly. *Julie Dow*

CATHEDRAL PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL REPORT, MARCH 2018

Our financial position as at 31 December 2017 has been audited to confirm a minor deficit of \$253. This compares with a surplus at end 2016 of \$108,239. So, all in all, 2017 was a challenging year for parish finances.

On the income side, the major impact was a \$105,000 reduction in interest income. There were some minor savings in expenditure (including around \$18,000 less spent on repairs and maintenance), but parish outgoings are largely fixed costs.

The budget for 2018 anticipates a deficit at 31 December of around \$175,000. This again shows the impact of more or less fixed outlays set against diminishing income streams. The Finance Council anticipates that planned giving will slowly continue to drift. Rental income is down (Edmund Rice Camps have relinquished their lease on 103 George Street, Thebarton), and term deposit interest rates continue to go down.

The Parish authorities have decided to upgrade personal security for both penitents and priests in our confessionals. This is a relatively straightforward matter in our suburban churches, but the three confessionals in use in the Cathedral will cost in the order of \$111,000 to upgrade – Heritage responsibilities come into play here.

Leaving aside the one-off 2018 expenditure on the confessionals, the 2018 operational deficit reduces to \$64,000. The Finance Council is actively working to find ways to reduce this deficit, while at the same time maintaining services to the parish.

The Finance Council continues to advise the Archbishop on ways to maximise parish income by developing property assets. Council is pleased to note that the Archbishop has accepted in principle our recommendation (still subject to final approvals) to construct two, two-storey, three-bedroom homes on the former tennis courts to the rear of St John Vianney Church. We are grateful to all those who contribute to our parish in so many ways. *Tony Versace OAM, Chair*

THE EUCHARIST IN SCRIPTURE

In its second offering for 2018, the Cathedral Parish Scripture Study program presents a module exploring the scriptural background of our celebration of the Eucharist, “the source and summit of the Christian life” (*Lumen Gentium* 11). Our study covers the prefigurations in the Old Testament, the Pauline and Synoptic accounts, early Church practice as described in the Acts of the Apostles as well as the Eucharistic discourse in John's Gospel.

Our program offers participants an opportunity to reflect on and discuss their faith in a supportive environment. Some “home-work” is required. The six sessions (April 9, 16, 23, 30, May 7 and 14) are between 7.30 and 9.30pm on Mondays in the Cathedral Hall. We invite participants to make any donation that is possible to support this Adult Faith Formation initiative. To help you discern your contribution, we offer two levels of payment to consider: full cost \$27, subsidised cost \$15. Participants should bring a Bible.
