World Mission Sunday Next Sunday

Pope Francis gives us the theme **Together with young people, let us bring the Gospel to all** for this year's Mission Sunday next Sunday which is taking place during the Bishops Synod on Youth, Faith and Vocational Discernment. In his statement Pope Francis says, *I dare say that, for a young man or woman who wants to follow Christ, what is most essential is to seek, to discover and to persevere in his or her vocation.* Pope Francis speaks of our baptism as the starting point in sharing the Mission of the Church, to witness to Jesus Christ in the world.

Earlier this year, Pope Francis said to young adults **Never think that you have nothing to offer, or that nobody needs you. Many people need you. Think about it! Each of you, think in your heart: many people need me.**

Next Sunday, World Mission Sunday, our prayer will focus on that essential task of witnessing, which belongs to all of us. There will also be a **Leaving Collection** to support missionaries and new emerging Catholic communities in developing nations. **Envelopes are available** for those who wish to receive a receipt for taxation purposes.

First Collection Renewal

Before the collectors take up the first collection today I wish to remind you that, our Parish and all Parishes throughout the Diocese are setting goals to increase our level of giving so we can continue to provide adequately for our clergy—now and in the future. Our aim is to increase the first collection beyond a 'loose change' level by doubling our Parish contribution over the next two years to a level closer to **\$5.00 per Mass attendee**—the target required to meet the real need.
