Remembrance Day

This Sunday, 11th November, is observed around the world as Remembrance Day.

At the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, in 1918, the peace treaty brought to an end the terrible World War I. Each year, at that time, we stop and observe a one minute silence.

World War I was one of the deadliest conflicts in the history of the human race, in which over **16 million people** died. The total number of both civilian and military casualties is estimated at around **37 million people**. The war killed almost 7 million civilians and 10 million military personnel.

For Australia, the First World War remains the costliest conflict in terms of deaths and casualties. From a population of fewer than five million, **416,809** men enlisted, of whom more than **60,000** were killed and **156,000** wounded, gassed, or taken prisoner.

World War I was described as "the war to end all wars", but since 1918 there have been numerous wars, each bringing further death and destruction, injuries, grief, homelessness, poverty and despair.

On the 4th October 1965, Saint Pope Paul VI was the first Pope to address the United Nations. In his moving speech he said, "There is no need for a long talk to proclaim the main purpose of your Institution. It is enough to recall that the blood of millions, countless unheard-of sufferings, useless massacres and frightening ruins have sanctioned the agreement that unites you with an oath that ought to change the future history of the world: never again war, never again war! It is peace, peace, that has to guide the destiny of the nations of all mankind!"

The Death Penalty

During the 20th century there was a growing concern about the death penalty as a form of punishment across the Church in in many nations. It was abolished across Australia in 1973. Malaysia recently abolished it – but still there are many places where it takes place.

Pope Francis has clarified Catholic teaching on this issue, stating that the sanctity of every life makes such a punishment to be immoral.

The Parish Scripture Group has been providing support to **Clinton Young a prisoner on death row in Texas** through prayer, letters and greeting cards. Reflections will include the story of Sr Helen Prejean CSJ who accompanied two men who suffered the death penalty in Louisiana. Her story was made into the film, "Dead Man Walking".
