My Sisters and Brothers,

We should all be extremely concerned about the proposed
Abortion Law Reform Bill introduced late last year by
Greens MP Tammy Franks which is due for debate in the
Legislative Council in coming weeks.

This bill drastically reduces safeguards for the unborn.
Abortions may be conducted even well into the ninth month
of pregnancy. The unborn deserve love and
protection, not destruction.

This bill treats abortion simply as a medical procedure
without moral significance. There is no need for a medical
opinion or a doctor's involvement and no reason need be
given for an abortion. It will be the most radical abortion
law in the country. There is no sense of the sacredness of
life.

We believe life to be a gift of God, to be cherished and
revered. Christ said that he came that we might have life
and have it to the full. Abortion is the destruction of the
human life, an act that defies the sacred.

We believe our main focus should be on supporting
women who find themselves faced with an unplanned
pregnancy and are grappling with this terrible choice, while
also offering our unequivocal support and prayers to those
women who are experiencing grief and loss.

I encourage you to talk to your local Member of Parliament
and urge them not to pass such a law.

Statue of Mary in the Cathedral

When the Nativity Scene was erected in the Cathedral for
Christmas, the statue of Mary was returned to the niche
where it was first placed in the **1950s** when the Marian
Shrine was erected. In recent years it was placed on the
altar. But the altar, a symbol of Christ, is a dedicated one,
and therefore is not a pedestal for statues. The Marian
Shrine was erected by Archbishop Beovich in the 1950's
and is much loved by parishioners and visitors. When it
arrived in Adelaide from Portugal, it was taken to every
church in the Archdiocese before being placed in the
cathedral. The image of St Mary of the Cross is now
placed on the **other side of the sanctuary**.

Financially Supporting the Parish

A foundation for the financial viability of any parish is the giving by parishioners to the **Second Collection** – through the weekly thanksgiving envelopes and through cash.

We record the giving for 2018 as a way of acknowledging the generosity of parishioners, and as a sign of transparency and accountability. Over coming weeks, information about other revenue streams and expenses will be given so that parishioners can understand the complexity of our parish finances.

Parish Giving to Project Compassion 2018

Recently we recorded in the Newsletter the donations of parishioners to the special additional collections taken up during the year to support diocesan and national works of the Church. At that time we did not have the figures for Project Compassion, which takes place every year during Lent through special home boxes and sets of envelopes. This money is then distributed through Caritas Australia in works of development across the world and in Australian Aboriginal communities. **The giving in 2018 was \$11,447.** Other amounts from parishioners have been given electronically and are processed in Sydney. They are not available at this time.

The Catholic Alliance for People Seeking Asylum will sponsor a panel and interactive discussion entitled **Advocacy and Service for People Seeking Asylum** on **Monday 18 February 2019, 6-8 pm** at the **Queen of Angels' Hall**, 141 South Road, Thebarton. Panel members will outline the situation for people seeking asylum and the practical ways in which Catholic services in Adelaide are attempting to support their needs. Panel members, including Mary Ireland, SVDP Migrant and Refugee Centre and Sr Mary Symonds rsm, Migration Agent, are very experienced in this field. This group was formed in 2014 by Jesuit Social Services and Cabrini Health. The website explains that it aims "to turn hearts and minds to compassion.
