St. Francis Xavier's Cathedral 2nd - 3rd March Day of the Unborn Child Appeal

In the Archdiocese of Adelaide, the Day of the Unborn Child occurs on the Feast of the Annunciation, March 25. As this feast day falls during Lent it was felt it would be more appropriate to hold the Appeal early this year.

A special collection is being taken up in support of the work undertaken by Birthline, Right to Life in South Australia, Matercare Australia & Genesis Pregnancy Support Inc .

The Day of the Unborn Child assists us to focus on those people in our families and communities who have experienced any form of child-bearing loss, whether miscarriage, still-birth, the death of a baby soon after birth, or abortion.

At a time when the South Australian Parliament will debate a bill broadening the availability of abortion in the widest way possible, which with the protests of many people of goodwill, can be defeated, supporting next week's special collection will be proof that we believe in the right to life of every child in the womb. Proceeds will support organisations which help couples and individuals who face an unplanned pregnancy. Every life deserves our respect and protection.

We thank you in anticipation for your generous support of those who work tirelessly with individuals and families who require these important resources and services.

Some Costs Related to the Parish

Our parish, with the Cathedral and its six churches, has considerable expenses like our own homes, but on a larger scale. Some of these from 2018 included:

Electricity	\$46,281
Water rates and usage	\$28,014
Cleaning and rubbish removal	\$71,144
Insurance	\$68,831
Repairs & Maintenance	\$192,352
Altar bread	\$14,782

In 2018 the parish also faced a one-off expense of \$120,000 for the remodelling of the four Cathedral Confessionals to conform with community expectations following the Royal Commission.

Being a heritage building inflated the costs. In 2017, \$35,000 was spent remodelling the confessionals at Holy Name, St Peter Claver, St John Vianney and Queen of Angels.

Repairs at St Mary's Church

St Mary's Church at North Adelaide will be closed from after Mass on Sunday 10th March through to Friday 15th March evening. The flooring in the centre aisle will be replaced. There will be no weekday Masses during that week.

World Day of Prayer – Next Friday 1st March

Every year, on the First Friday of March, an Ecumenical Prayer Service is held around the world in thousands of churches. This was formally called Women's World Day of Prayer, but more recently broadened out to invite everyone.

Each year the service used is prepared by women from one country – and this year it is the Women of Slovenia, with the theme "Come, everything is ready". For the city of Adelaide, this year's service will be in **St Peter's Cathedral**, King William Rd., North Adelaide on **Friday 1st March at 10am**. Parishioners are warmly welcomed to share this time of prayer with other Christians.
