The Celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation

Lent, with its call to repentance and renewal, is the time when many Catholics wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This Sacrament calls on us to reflect on our lives, to search our hearts, and to confess our sins with humility. Here we encounter a God, not of vengeance, but a God of Mercy.

Through the ministry of the Church, given through the apostles on Easter Sunday by the Risen Jesus, sin is forgiven, hope restored, peace given, and our Christian life made more dynamic.

Good Friday Collection

At all the Good Friday Liturgies a Collection is taken up to support the Christian Community in the Holy Land and the preservation of the 74 holy places associated with the life of Jesus. The diminishing population of Christians in the Holy Land struggles in today's complex situation, especially those who live on the West Bank or Occupied Territories. This annual collection enables them to have access to schools and medical centres, the Catholic university in Bethlehem and pastoral care in their parishes.

Information about Holy Week

Passion (Palm) Sunday

At the Cathedral: The Solemn blessing of the palms will take place at **10.30am** in the Mary MacKillop Plaza. Following the blessing all process into the Cathedral for the celebration of the Eucharist.

Parishioners who cannot manage the procession are invited to be seated in the Cathedral before the blessing. The other Masses will begin with the Simple Blessing of Palms at the entrance of the Cathedral itself. Procession is only the celebrant and servers. **At the Other Churches,** The Solemn Blessing and Procession will take place at the Principal Mass. Simple Blessing at the others.

Holy Monday Morning Prayer in the Cathedral at 8am.

The priests and deacons will attend a morning of reflection at the Passionist Monastery. In place of the 12.10pm Mass there will be **Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion.** Confessions at 11am will take place.

The Chrism Mass will be celebrated at 6pm in the Cathedral. During this Mass the Holy Oils used in the celebration of the Sacraments will be blessed and consecrated by Bishop Greg O'Kelly SJ. The Renewal of Priestly Promises also takes place during this Mass. The people of the Archdiocese are invited to this Mass.

Holy Tuesday and Wednesday Parish programme as usual with additional Confessions times.

Holy Thursday The only Mass permitted this day is the Mass of the Lord's Supper in the evening. **Morning Prayer** will be offered in the Cathedral at 8am.

Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated across the parish: Cathedral, St Mary's and St Peter Claver at 7.30pm. Queen of Angels at 8pm.

They include the ritual of the Washing of Feet after the homily. The Cathedral and Churches **remain open until 11pm** for private adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, placed upon the Altar of Repose.

Holy Saturday In the Cathedral: Morning Prayer at 8am

The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night

At the Cathedral: The Blessing of the Easter Fire and the Paschal Candle will take place in the Mary MacKillop Plaza starting at 7.30pm. The procession into the Cathedral will follow. Lights will be left on for safety reasons until everyone is in place. Then, in darkness, the Paschal Candle will be brought into the Cathedral and light from it will be dispersed to the people's candles. Those unable to take part in the procession are asked to take their places in the Cathedral before 7.30pm, This year the full Liturgy of the Word will take place with 9 readings. There will be two adult baptisms.

At St Peter Claver and St Mary's: The Vigil is at 7.30pm

Queen of Angels: It is at 7pm. The blessing of the fire will take place outside, and the same safety arrangements of the Cathedral will be in place for the procession.
