Good Friday Collection

At all the Good Friday Liturgies a Collection is taken up to support the Christian Community in the Holy Land and the preservation of the 74 holy places associated with the life of Jesus. The diminishing population of Christians in the Holy Land struggles in today's complex situation, especially those who live on the West Bank or Occupied Territories. This annual collection enables them to have access to schools and medical centres, the Catholic university in Bethlehem and pastoral care in their parishes.

Information about Holy Week

Holy Monday: Morning Prayer in the Cathedral at 8am.

The priests and deacons will attend a morning of reflection at the Passionist Monastery.

In place of the 12.10pm Mass, there will be **Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion**. Confessions will take place at 11am.

The Chrism Mass will be celebrated at 6 pm during which the Holy Oils are blessed will be celebrated at 6pm in the Cathedral.

Holy Tuesday and Wednesday: Parish programme as usual with additional Confessions times.

Holy Thursday: Morning Prayer in the Cathedral at 8am.

Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7.30pm at Cathedral, St Mary's and St Peter Claver. Queen of Angels at 8pm.

The Cathedral is open till 11 pm and other churches remain open until 10 pm for private adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, placed upon the Altar of Repose.

Easter Vigil Service

At the Cathedral: The Blessing of the Easter Fire and the Paschal Candle will take place in the Mary MacKillop Plaza starting at 7.30pm. The procession into the Cathedral will follow. Lights will be left on for safety reasons until everyone is in place. Then, in darkness, the Paschal Candle will be brought into the Cathedral and light from it will be dispersed to the people's candles. Those unable to take part in the procession are asked to take their places in the Cathedral before 7.30pm. This year the full Liturgy of the Word will take place with 9 readings. There will be two adult baptisms.

At St Peter Claver and St Mary's: The Vigil is at 7.30pm.

At Queen of Angels: The vigil is at 7pm. The blessing of the fire will take place outside, and the same safety arrangements of the Cathedral will be in place for the procession.

Upgrading of parish property for rental in George St., Thebarton: smoke alarms, hot water unit, pipe repairs \$10,500

Fire escape door changes, Queen of Angels \$1,554

St Mary's Church floor boards replaced \$4,159

Holy Name car park bitumen repairs \$22,783

St Patrick's roof repairs \$6,000

Staircase to the loft at Queen of Angels – money raised by parishioners and the Syro-Malabar Community \$64,236. It is hoped that work will begin soon after Easter.

Balancing the budget in 2019 will demand close attention, reducing costs wherever we can.

Flowers in the Cathedral and Churches: This is a significant expense and from now on the parish will pay for arrangements in the churches for Easter, Pentecost, Patronal Feasts, Christ the King and Christmas. The Cathedral will receive one arrangement for each Sunday. In the other churches parishioners are welcome to donate flowers from their own gardens. Speak to the members of your Community Life Committees to work out how this can happen.
