Something Special From Bethlehem

On the weekend **11th/12th May** there will be religious items – rosaries, crucifixes, plaques and statues for sale at the Cathedral Masses. These are made from olive wood by Christian families in Bethlehem. This is a primary source of income for these families in the town of Jesus' birth where the Christian population has fallen from 80% to just 18% today. Among these items will be suitable gifts for the occasions of baptism, first Communion and Confirmations as well as for personal devotion.
