To our Sinhalese Parishioners

We extend our sincere condolences and prayer to our Sinhalese parishioners, following the bomb attacks on churches and hotels in Sri Lanka on the Sunday of the Resurrection. The terrible loss of life and the numbers of people injured have left so many people grieving and distressed.

Tonight, **Sunday 28th April** the Rosary and Litany will be recited in the Cathedral at **5.30pm** by the Sinhalese community, followed by the usual Mass at 6pm celebrated by Fr. Philip Marshall, Administrator Delegate of the Archdiocese, to pray for all who died, those injured and those left grieving.

Monsignor Robert Aitken to turn 90

During May, Monsignor Robert Aitken, former Administrator of St Francis Xavier Cathedral for 30 years will celebrate his 90th birthday. Following his Cathedral appointment he was the parish priest of St. Peter Claver and St. John Vianney (now part of the Adelaide Cathedral Parish).

Monsignor Aitken will celebrate the **11am Mass on Sunday 12th May**. This will be followed by a morning tea in the Cathedral Hall. Parishioners are invited to bring some food to share for the morning tea.

Monsignor Aitken gave great leadership at the Cathedral through the years that he was Assistant Priest and then Administrator. He was renowned for his lectures on the Catholic faith which enabled many people to receive baptism as well as those who chose to enter the Catholic Church.

During his time the Cathedral hosted what was popularly called 'the rock Mass' on Sunday nights, which drew a packed cathedral week after week for years. During his time, under the leadership of Archbishop Faulkner, the tower on the cathedral was completed, and the cathedral was solemnly dedicated.

The Mass for his 90th birthday gives us the opportunity to give thanks for the ministry of Monsignor Aitken, within the parish and beyond.
