Religious items of rosaries, crucifixes, statues and plaques, made by the Christian families in Bethlehem out of local olive wood, will be on sale at all the Masses in the Cathedral next weekend, **11th-12th May**. Monies raised will be an important support for the diminishing number of Christians who live in the place of Jesus' birth, and will help to maintain their Christian presence in that city.

An Apology

In last week's newsletter and Universal Prayer I referred to the people of Sri Lanka as the Sinhalese people, but in fact they are one of several ethnic groups who make up the people of Sri Lanka. My sincere apology for any offense that I may have been given. We continue to hold the people of Sri Lanka in our prayers, with a particular concern for our own parishioners who grieve the violence of the bombings.

Last Sunday, the evening Mass had a focus on the people of Sri Lanka, and was attended by the Governor, Premier, Leader of the Opposition, several other members of parliament, the Consul for Sri Lanka, Muslim Imams and Buddhist monks and representatives of the Hindu and Jewish faiths.

A Special Collection for those affected by the bombings raised \$7,097.10 at that Mass.
