Our Lady, Help of Christians

The first record of this title for Mary is found in a sermon of St. John Chrysostom in 345 AD. In 1524 the title Advocate of Christians was found in a Litany in honour of Mary and in 1576 it appears as 'Help of Christians' in what we know today as the Litany of Loreto. Mary was invoked under this title when Christian Europe was attacked by non-Christian forces, especially in the Battle of Lepanto on 7th October 1571. In 1802 Pope Pius VII was arrested by Napoleon I of France. He was set free and arrived back in Rome on the 24th May 1814. The next year, Pius VII fled Rome as Napoleon's forces threatened Rome. He returned a few months later and instituted the Feast of Mary, Help of Christians to be held on 24th May each year.

When Fr. John Joseph Therry came to Sydney as a pioneering priest in 1820 he brought with him a devotion to Mary under this title. The next year the foundation stone was laid for a cathedral under the title, "Help of Christians" more popularly known as St Mary's. Likewise, Bishop Francis Murphy dedicated the first church in South Australia under the same title at Morphett Vale. It was opened in January 1846. In 1844 the bishops of Australia had named Mary, Help of Christians, as the national patroness. St. Mary's Church in North Adelaide, is dedicated to Mary, Help of Christians and was built in 1877 as part of the Cathedral Parish.

St. Mary of the Cross established a school there and visited the church on occasions. In 1898 it became a separate parish, and returned to the cathedral in 2007. This title of Mary has two relevant messages for the 21st century. Just as the apostles and disciples gathered around Mary in prayer after the Ascension of Jesus, waiting for the Holy Spirit, so she gathers the Church around her today in prayer. Europeans in the 18th century referred to this, then unknown land, as 'the great southern land of the Holy Spirit'. As we live in the Holy Spirit through our baptism, Mary is the one who prays with us and for us as we live our Christian life.

In the past, in times when forces gathered against Christians, they called to Mary as their Help. Today there are forces against Christians, seen not only in widespread persecution, but also in the denial of freedom of religion in various countries, and the opposition seen in secular societies. Unlike the past when the Church formed armies to defeat her enemies, we use prayer for the safety of Christians, the softening of hardened hearts, for religious tolerance and respect.

Mary, Help of Christians, pray for us, pray for Australia.
