## Corpus Christi

This will be an opportunity to reflect upon the wonderful gift of the Eucharist and to adore Jesus present in this unique way. The procession will conclude with Benediction. This addition to the 11am Mass will take about 15-20 minutes.

The statue of Our Lady of Fatima, which has been in the Cathedral since 1951, is undergoing some restoration. Sculptured from wood with a poly chrome finish, it was carved by Guilherme Ferreirs Thedin (1900-1985) in Portugal, He was the brother of Jose, who carved the statue which is on the exact spot there Mary appeared to the children Lucia, Jacinta and Francesco in 1917.

Guilherme wanted to be a priest, but because of illness, he left the seminary and, following the family tradition, devoted his life to sacred art, learning from his elder brother. He worked in wood, terracotta, anemone stone and marble. He was one of the few people authorised to correspond with Lucia who had become a Carmelite Nun, and from her, he learnt to perfect the images of Mary. He was renowned as a master "very perfectionist and very methodical." His works of art are found across Europe as well as other parts of the world.

Archbishop Matthew Beovich commissioned the statue for the Cathedral, and placed it there in 1951, following a Marian Congress to mark the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Federation of Australia. At that time the statue was taken to every parish in the Archdiocese for days of prayer and devotion.
