Procession in Honour of the Blessed Sacrament

Today, at the conclusion of the 11am Mass, a procession in honour of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the Cathedral. The feast itself was begun by Bishop Robert de Thorte of Leige in 1246 and extended to the Universal Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. The text of the prayers and hymns were written by St Thomas Aquinas.

Pope Gregory VII (1015-1085) responding to a heresy of Berengarius who denied the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, reaffirmed the Catholic teaching of Christ's Presence. In his time, Processions of the Blessed Sacrament began in Europe, often through the streets of towns and villages. In France, in the 12th century, after the Consecration, the Host was held up high for an extended time so that the people could gaze upon It in adoration of Jesus present. This quickly spread throughout the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church. The first record of the blessing of the people with the Blessed Sacrament was in 1301 in Germany.

This liturgy quickly grew in popularity, partly because the people so rarely received Holy Communion. To gaze upon the Blessed Sacrament was accepted as a replacement for not receiving Holy Communion. People had an overwhelming sense of not being worthy to receive the Sacrament. Even the Poor Clares, founded by St Francis of Assisi, only received Holy Communion 6 times a year.

When in the time of Pope Pius XII, the rules concerning fasting from food and drink before receiving Holy Communion were relaxed, and evening Masses because possible, more and more people received Holy Communion at least monthly. The renewal of the liturgy, inspired by the teachings of the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), saw an even more frequent receiving of Holy Communion by Catholics – weekly and even daily.

In more recent years, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with Benediction has once again become a popular form of prayer. This adoration extends the prayer of the Eucharistic celebration, and at the same time, awakens in the heart of the believer a stronger desire to receive the Lord himself.
