Message from Fr. Anthoni Adimai SdM

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Greetings and prayers from Fr. Anthoni.

I am grateful to all our parishioners, members of the choir, altar servers, sacristans, the Archdiocesan Events office team, and the people from the Other Way Centre for your support in the celebration of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders Sunday.

In today's gospel, Jesus answering to the question "who is my neighbour?" has demolished all boundary expectations. It is not social definitions such as class, religion, gender, or ethnicity that determines who is our neighbour. A neighbour is a person who acts with compassion toward another. The point becomes not who deserves to be loved as I love myself, but that I become a person who treats everyone with compassion.

In the Good Samaritan parable, the Samaritan not only goes over to the injured man but cleans his wounds, puts him on his own animal, takes him to an inn to recover, and promises to pay all his expenses. The hated enemy is the compassionate neighbour in this parable.

Pope Francis in his address on May 14th to the diocesan leaders at St. John Lateran Basilica said "Our parishes," he said, "must be capable of generating a people that is, of offering and creating relationships where people feel that they are known, recognized, welcomed, listened to, and loved— in other words, not anonymous parts of a whole."

May our journey with Jesus, open our hearts and minds to the invitation of Jesus to be Good Samaritans in our work places, and parish community.

Though it is not a farewell but to wish him well in all his future ministry, may I invite all of you to join us in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist on the 14th July at 11.00 am and shared lunch thereafter at the Cathedral Hall. I request all of you to bring a plate of food to share and gather to express our gratitude to Fr. Maurice Shinnick.

Ivan Shearer was Emeritus Professor of Law at the University of Sydney, having retired from the Challis Chair of International Law of that University in 2003. In 1995 he was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia (AM). Professor Shearer served as an elected member of the United Nations Human Rights Committee from 2001-2008 He was currently an Adjunct Professor in the School of Law, University of South Australia. Adelaide Cathedral Parish Scripture Study Program 2019

When was the Catholic Church founded? Why do we go to Church on Sunday? Why do we venerate relics? Why do we have a sacrament of confirmation? The answers to these questions, and more, can be found in the "Acts of the Apostles" which is the focus of our next study session. This book is the first chapter of the history of our Church and is critical for our understanding of who and what we are as Church today. The study commences on Monday, 5 August in the Cathedral Hall (between 7.30 and 9 pm) and concludes on 14 October.

The course materials cost \$25 (concessions \$15) and include a copy of the text with commentary and a work book. This is an introductory course suitable for people with limited knowledge of the scriptures or for people who wish to revise. The module offers an opportunity to deepen personal spirituality through prayerful study of God's word.

For those continuing participants who have completed this unit previously there will be an advanced module running concurrently. Places for the advanced course are limited. Participants will be provided with alternative materials (at a cost of \$5).
