Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Greetings and prayers from Fr. Anthoni.

The story of Jesus in the home of Martha and Mary complements the story of the Good Samaritan, which immediately precedes it in Luke's Gospel. The Samaritan is an example of how a disciple should see and act. Mary is an example of how a disciple should listen. Just as a Samaritan would not be a model for neighbourliness, so a woman would not sit with the men around the feet of a teacher. Both stories exemplify how a disciple is to fulfill the dual command which begins chapter 10—love of God (Mary) and love of neighbour (the Samaritan). These are the two essentials of life in the kingdom.

See below the prayer of Pope Francis during his visit to the Mother Teresa Memorial in Bulgaria on 6th May 2019. May this be our prayers too as we gather in our churches this weekend.

“Saint Mother Teresa, mother of the poor, we ask for your special intercession and help, here in this city where you were born, where you had your home. Here you received the gift of rebirth in the sacraments of Christian initiation. Here you heard the first words of faith in your family and in the community of the faithful. Here you began to see and meet people in need, the poor and the helpless. Here you learned from your parents to love those in greatest need and to help them. Here, in the silence of the church, you heard the call of Jesus to follow him as a religious in the missions.

Here in this place, we ask you to intercede with Jesus, that we too may obtain the grace to be watchful and attentive to the cry of the poor, those deprived of their rights, the sick, the outcast and the least of our brothers and sisters. May he grant us the grace to see him in the eyes of all who look to us in their need. May he grant us a heart capable of loving God present in every man and woman, a heart capable of recognizing him in those who experience suffering and injustice.

May he grant us the grace to become signs of love and hope in our own day, when so many are poor, abandoned, marginalized and migrants. May he grant that our love not only be on our lips, but that it be effective and genuine, so that we may bear credible witness to the Church whose duty it is to proclaim the Good News to the poor, freedom to prisoners, joy to the afflicted and the grace of salvation to all.”

Prof. Ivan Shearer A.M. Rest in Peace

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Professor Ivan Shearer A.M. Ivan was a loyal parishioner at the 11 am Sunday Mass at the Cathedral, and a keen and active member of the PPC. Ivan Shearer was Emeritus Professor of Law at the University of Sydney, having retired from the Challis Chair of International Law of that University in 2003. In 1995 he was appointed a Member of the Order of Australia (AM). Professor Shearer served as an elected member of the United Nations Human Rights Committee from 2001-2008. He was currently an Adjunct Professor in the School of Law, University of South Australia. Professor Shearer was a member of the Bars of New South Wales, Victoria and South Australia, and has appeared in cases before the higher Australian courts including the High Court of Australia. May His Soul rest in peace. The Funeral Mass is at St Laurence's on Monday 22nd July at 2pm.

Reminder Notice No Disabled Cathedral Car Parking

From Monday to Friday from July to October 2019, the disabled carpark will be out of bounds due to completion of the new roof on the Diocesan Centre.

The disabled cannot park in front of the side foyer doors of the cathedral as this space will be used for trade vehicles and there is no access at all to the parking area behind the sacristy. **Please do make alternate arrangements if you are visiting the Cathedral during these times.**

The reason being that cranes and other heavy vehicles need to have access and they cannot drive through with vehicles being parked in the disabled parking area. Cranes will have to lift material over the area normally reserved for disabled car parking and this will be a risk to both people and their vehicles.

We regret the inconvenience caused during this time and thank you for your cooperation in this regard.

Adelaide Cathedral Parish Scripture Study Program 2019

When was the Catholic Church founded? Why do we go to Church on Sunday? Why do we venerate relics? Why do we have a sacrament of confirmation? The answers to these questions, and more, can be found in the "Acts of the Apostles" which is the focus of our next study session. This book is the first chapter of the history of our Church and is critical for our understanding of who and what we are as Church today. The study commences on Monday, 5 August in the Cathedral Hall (between 7.30 and 9 pm) and concludes on 14 October.

The course materials cost \$25 (concessions \$15) and include a copy of the text with commentary and a work book. This is an introductory course suitable for people with limited knowledge of the scriptures or for people who wish to revise. Combining home study with group discussions (one conducted in Vietnamese), the module offers an opportunity to deepen personal spirituality through prayerful study of God's word.

For those continuing participants who have completed this unit previously there will be an advanced module running concurrently. Places for the advanced course are limited. Participants will be provided with alternative materials (at a cost of \$5).
