Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Greetings and prayers from Fr. Anthoni.

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches the disciples how to pray. There are six P's of Prayer and they are: *Presence, Praise, Purpose, Petition, Pardon, and Protection*. These six elements should be present any time we pray. In this Jesus is not just giving us one prayer to say — the *Lord's Prayer* — he's also giving us a framework to guide us in all of our prayer, whatever words we use. We should place our self in God's presence, praise him, commit to doing his will, petition him regarding our needs, pardon others and seek his protection.

To these six p's Jesus adds a seventh "p" in the parable with which today's Gospel ends: Persistence. A man who wouldn't get out of bed at midnight to help a neighbour for friendship's sake will give in and answer his request if he just keeps knocking persistently, and God the Father will do the same. So in today's Gospel, with the addition of this parable, Jesus actually gives us Seven P's of Prayer: *presence, praise, purpose, petition, pardon, protection and persistence*.

Pope Benedict XVI, Jesus of Nazareth: From the Baptism in the Jordan to the Transfiguration: "Praying actualizes and deepens our communion with God. Our prayer can and should arise above all from our heart, from our needs, our hopes, our joys, our sufferings, from our shame over sin, and from our gratitude from the good. It can and should be a wholly personal prayer."

My prayer and wish to all of us is that we be united in Christ Jesus in prayer as Christ taught us to call God our Father.

Important Reminder Notice No Disabled Cathedral Car Parking

From Monday to Friday from July to October 2019, the disabled carpark will be out of bounds due to completion of the new roof on the Diocesan Centre.

The disabled cannot park in front of the side foyer doors of the cathedral as this space will be used for trade vehicles and there is no access at all to the parking area behind the sacristy. **Please do make alternate arrangements if you are visiting the Cathedral during these times.**

The reason being that cranes and other heavy vehicles need to have access and they cannot drive through with vehicles being parked in the disabled parking area. Cranes will have to lift material over the area normally reserved for disabled car parking and this will be a risk to both people and their vehicles.

We regret the inconvenience caused during this time and thank you for your cooperation in this regard.

Adelaide Cathedral Parish Scripture Study Program 2019

When was the Catholic Church founded? Why do we go to Church on Sunday? Why do we venerate relics? Why do we have a sacrament of confirmation? The answers to these questions, and more, can be found in the "Acts of the Apostles" which is the focus of our next study session. This book is the first chapter of the history of our Church and is critical for our understanding of who and what we are as Church today. The study commences on Monday, 5 August in the Cathedral Hall (between 7.30 and 9 pm) and concludes on 14 October.

The course materials cost \$25 (concessions \$15) and include a copy of the text with commentary and a work book. This is an introductory course suitable for people with limited knowledge of the scriptures or for people who wish to revise. The module offers an opportunity to deepen personal spirituality through prayerful study of God's word.

For those continuing participants who have completed this unit previously there will be an advanced module running concurrently. Places for the advanced course are limited. Participants will be provided with alternative materials (at a cost of \$5).
