Police Check Screening Processes Revised from September 1, 2019

Dear Parishioners,

We understand there has been some resistance to the new rules governing police checks. The requirement for everyone 14 years and older to have a current police check is not to be taken personally. The new laws have not been introduced to question anyone's personal integrity but rather to ensure that we have done all we can to keep all who work and volunteer within the parish as safe as we possibly can. All clergy, religious, staff, counters, readers, Eucharistic ministers, altar servers and anyone else who most generously gives their time can take comfort knowing that everyone they are working alongside also have clearances. The parish itself is not responsible for the changes. The new changes are part of Government legislation. This means it is now the law and there can be no exceptions. The office staff and Police Check Volunteers for each church are there to assist the Screening and Verification Authority by preparing the applications with everyone and to try and make the process as easy as possible.
