## Dear Sisters and Brothers,

The second reading of this weekend is taken from the Letter to the Philippians. The words of encouragement and comfort which St. Paul wrote to the converts in Philippi community, is an encouragement and comfort for us today. "Have no anxiety about anything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." St. Paul tells us to make our needs known to God through prayer and supplication with thanksgiving.

The primary purpose of prayer is adoration. We recognize God as our creator and pay our homage. The second end of prayer is thanksgiving. We show gratitude to God for the many gifts we have gratuitously received. St. Paul tells us today, the true prayer that will bring us peace of God – peace of mind in this life and eternal peace and happiness in the life to come – for it will keep us united closely with Christ.

The true Christian life is a life of continual prayer. Our Lord told his disciples that they should pray continually (Lk 18:1). Prayer is not only the few moments of each day or each week which we spend on our knees; it is the dedication of our whole life to God. Our life is thus dedicated to God in our baptism, but we need to renew that dedication again and again during our lives.

Today we are reminded to renew that dedication once more. It is of the essence of a Christian life, it is through the daily prayer of our work and recreation, interspersed and activated by verbal or oral prayer in the home or in Church, that we can earn the peace of God which surpasses all human understanding.

In the Gospel, we see the mercy and benevolence of God sending his Son on earth. He took our human nature, lived among us and preached his gospel of love and peace to us. In God's plan of love and mercy the tragedy of Calvary turned out to be the "triumph of failure."

The death of Jesus brought life to the world and opened the gates of God's eternal kingdom. Let us thank God and pray that God will keep us in the right path to live the Gospel and invite others to participate in the life of Christ.

## Compliance with COVID-19 Protocols

- The two-square metres per person rule is to be observed in determining the total numbers allowed in the space.
- Except for families and household groups, people should be at least 1.5 metres apart.
- There should be no physical contact outside one's family or household group. There should be no shaking of hands or holding hands during the Mass.
- Every gathering must record contact details. Logs are located at the entrance to the church.
- Hand sanitiser is to be available at church entrances.
- Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- No collection plates or hymn books are to be passed around.
- Communion is given only in hands.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people should be encouraged not to attend.
- Collection plates will not be passed around but a single drop point is provided at the churches.
- Offertory procession will be omitted.
- Care should be taken at the dismissal and on leaving the church to minimise social contact.

Just a reminder that all children need to be accompanied to and from the toilet, ideally by an adult family member. Kindly ensure that children are supervised by an adult family member in the carparks at all times.
