Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We celebrate the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time and we continue to reflect on the Gospel of Matthew. Today's parable of the two sons is the first of the three parables, "Parable of the two sons, Parable of the wicked tenants, and the parable of the wedding banquet" to show the characteristics of the chief priests and elders, and the perilous position in which they stood in relation to God. It is, however, a warning against hypocrisy of all time.

The second reading is taken from the Letter to the Philippians in which St. Paul urges his people to live in unity of love and mutual charity. Each one must esteem the other as of more importance than oneself and be ready to help others in every way. In doing so, we imitate our Saviour Jesus Christ who although Creator became a creature.

The basic dogma of the church is that Christ, who was born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem, spent his childhood and youth in Nazareth, travelled through the valleys and over the hills of Palestine preaching the good news of their eternal salvation, that he was the Son of God in human nature. During his public life he often claimed to be the Son of God.

His resurrection from the dead changed the Apostles and his other followers. His appearance to them convinced them that he was indeed the real Son of God, who had taken human nature in order to raise us to the divine nature and to take away the sins of the world through his sufferings and death. From Pentecost day, the mission of the disciples in life was to bring this good news – the gospel of Christ – to all.

The disciples of Christ continue this mission till today, in spite of persecutions, sufferings, and martyrdom. This is the truth of Christianity. Let us pray to God that we will never forget this truth. As St. Paul encourages the new Gentile Christians to live this truth in love and unity; through their participation in Christ, through their love for God, and their fellowship in the Holy Spirit, let us encourage each other to live the message of the Risen Christ, "Peace be with you".

Holy Father's Appeal October 3rd/4th 2020

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Holy Father declared that this year the Peter's Pence collection, which traditionally takes place around the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul on June 29, would be transferred throughout the world to the 27th Sunday of Ordinary Time October 4, feast of St Francis of Assisi. The Peter's Pence collection provides Pope Francis with the funds to carry out his charitable works around the world.

Compliance with COVID-19 Protocols

- The two-square metres per person rule is to be observed in determining the total numbers allowed in the space.
- Except for families and household groups, people should be at least 1.5 metres apart.
- There should be no physical contact outside one's family or household group. There should be no shaking of hands or holding hands during the Mass.
- Every gathering must record contact details. Logs are located at the entrance to the church.
- Hand sanitiser is to be available at church entrances.
- Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- No collection plates or hymn books are to be passed around.
- Communion is given only in hands.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people should be encouraged not to attend.
- Collection plates will not be passed around but a single drop point is provided at the churches.
- Offertory procession will be omitted.
- Care should be taken at the dismissal and on leaving the church to minimise social contact.

Congregational Singing is suspended

Congregational singing has temporarily ceased in the Cathedral Parish as per the advice has been given by SA Health and supported by Archbishop O'Regan.
