A Message from Archbishop Patrick O'Regan regarding COVID-19 Restrictions for Church Services

Dear sisters and brothers,

As you would be aware the South Australian Premier Steven Marshall made an announcement late this morning. The state-wide lockdown will cease effective from **midnight Saturday, 21st November 2020**.

This means that **churches may re-open** following the guidelines outlined below:

Churches are capped at **100 people whilst maintaining 1 person per 4 square metres**.

Funerals are capped at **50 people whilst maintaining 1 person per 4 square metres**.

Weddings in churches cannot exceed the **150 people permitted in church whilst maintaining 1 person per 4 square metres** and registration of all guests are required with SA Health.

We ask for your continued cooperation in this matter.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

"Jesus, remember me when you come in your kingly power" (Lk 23:42).

On this last Sunday of the liturgical year, we join our voices to that of the criminal crucified beside Jesus, who acknowledged and acclaimed him a king. Amid cries of ridicule and humiliation, at the least triumphant and glorious moment possible, that thief was able to speak up and make his profession of faith. His were the last words Jesus heard, and Jesus' own words in reply were the last he spoke before abandoning himself to the Father: "Truly I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise" (Lk 23:43).

The chequered history of the thief seems, in an instant, to take on new meaning: he was meant to be there to accompany the Lord's suffering. And that moment does nothing more than confirm the entire meaning of Jesus' life: always and everywhere to offer salvation. The attitude of the good thief makes the horror and injustice of Calvary – where helplessness and incomprehension are met with jeers and mockery from those indifferent to the death of an innocent man – become a message of hope for all humanity. "Save yourself!"

Today, in this place, we want to renew our faith and our commitment. We know too well the history of our failures, sins and limitations, even as the good thief did, but we do not want them to be what determines or defines our present and future. We know how readily all of us can take the easy route of shouting out: "Save yourself!" and choose not to think about our responsibility to alleviate the suffering of innocent people all around us. Like the good thief, we want to speak up and profess our faith, to defend and assist the Lord, the innocent man of sorrows. We want to accompany him in his ordeal, to stand by him in his isolation and abandonment, and to hear once more that salvation is the word the Father desires to speak to all: "Today you will be with me in Paradise".

Our faith is in the God of the living. Christ is alive and at work in our midst, leading all of us to the fullness of life. He is alive and wants us to be alive; he is our hope (cf. [Christus Vivit](#), 1). Each day we pray: Lord, may your kingdom come. On that day at Calvary, many voices remained silent; others jeered. Only the thief's voice rose to the defence of the innocent victim of suffering. His was a brave profession of faith. Each of us has the same possibility: we can choose to remain silent, to jeer or to prophesy.

Compliance with Revised COVID Protocols

- Please enter your names and contact details in the sheets provided at the entrance the church.
- **The four-square metres per person rule is to be observed in determining the total numbers allowed in the space.**
- **Except for families and household groups, people should be at least 3 metres apart.**
- There should be no physical contact outside one's family or household group. There should be no shaking of hands or holding hands during the Mass.
- Every gathering must record contact details. Logs are located at the entrance to the church.
- Hand sanitiser is to be available at church entrances.
- Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- No collection plates or hymn books are to be passed around.
- Communion is given only in hands.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people should be encouraged not to attend.
- Collection plates will not be passed around but a single drop point is provided at the churches.
- Offertory procession will be omitted.
- Care should be taken at the dismissal and on leaving the church to minimise social contact.
- **Please follow the safety instructions of the designated COVID Marshals when you are attending services in all churches of the Parish. Thank you for your cooperation.**
