Your peace will rest upon him

The Gospel we have just heard tells us that, as well as the Twelve Apostles, Jesus calls another seventy-two disciples and that he sends them to the villages and cities to announce the Kingdom of God (cf. Lk 10:1-9, 17-20). He comes to bring the love of God to the world and he wishes to share it by means of communion and fraternity. To this end he immediately forms a community of disciples, a missionary community, and he trains them how to "go out" on mission. The method is both clear and simple: the disciples visit homes and their preaching begins with a greeting which is charged with meaning: "Peace be to this house!". It is not only a greeting, but also a gift: the gift of peace.

In the mission of the seventy-two disciples we see a reflection of the Christian community's missionary experience in every age: the risen and living Lord sends not only the Twelve, but the entire Church; he sends each of the baptised to announce the Gospel to all peoples. Through the ages, the message of peace brought by Jesus' messengers has not always been accepted; at times, the doors have been closed to them.

At this present time, the doors are closed, locked by the chains of prohibitions and prescriptions of a system which denied God and impeded religious freedom. Those who are afraid of the truth did everything they could to banish God from the hearts of men and women and to exclude Christ and the Church.

Jesus equips us with the message we must bring to our world: "Peace be with this house." It is a gift we must offer to our world. Jesus knows very well that this is what our world needs most, and he is ever ready to let us have it. With the peace that Christ offers us, we must be prepared to transform our world from a culture of war and hatred to a culture of peace. He invites us to be instruments of his peace. What we must bring to our world is the good news of the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Peace is precious and golden. Like joy, it is contagious. If we have peace, it must affect others positively. Therefore, like Francis of Assisi, let us pray: "Lord, make me an instrument of your peace, where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; and where there is sadness, joy."

24 July: Second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly

Pope Francis has proclaimed the Second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly to be held on Sunday 24th July 2022. In announcing this, Pope Francis has chosen the theme "In old age they will still bear fruit." -Psalm 92:15.

It is held on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. The Holy Father said he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because "grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on" what the elderly have received. He emphasised the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, because "as the prophet Joel says, grandparents seeing their grandchildren dream," while people, drawing strength voung from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy."

COVID-19 Protocols Update: 17 June 2022

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 please follow the instructions as per SA Health in terms of contact tracing and isolating yourself as per government health protocols. <u>Please stay home</u> and do not attend church services till you have fully recovered.
- The density requirement has been updated to full capacity in all churches and also includes funerals and weddings.
