The Grand Priory in Australia is the Hon. Chevalier Gavin L. Fielding AM GCLJ KMLJ.

The Order of St. Lazarus is an order of chivalry. It is wholly Christian, Ecumenical and has Christian Unity as an objective. Its members are committed to seek to live their lives with strength, simplicity and charity in a manner that embodies the Christian Spirit that has enlivened the Order for nearly a thousand years. The Volunteer Briefing will be held in our Parish on 17th May at 10.00am in the Cathedral Parish Hall.

Please note: the content of the session is not suitable for children and young people (under 18 years old) to attend so please make alternative care arrangements for your children before attending a Volunteer Briefing.

The Federal election is on 21st May 21 and since the beginning of the year the J4RSA Management Committee, supporters and members, have been working tirelessly to engage directly with sitting MPs, senators and candidates in key seats around SA. This engagement has also included meeting with and writing to candidates and political influencers, as well raising questions in local candidate forums. We have held workshops on How to engage with your MP young supporters. As a focal point of this engagement the committee developed the Four Priorities for Change with supporting documents, Economic Resources List, and Health Impacts on Refugees in Detention. Along with this South Australian-based activity, Justice for Refugees SA has been working in collaboration with more than 140 organisations around Australia to raise awareness of the issues facing refugees and people seeking asylum, with voters and our future federal politicians. The support of the Catholic dioceses of SA has enabled Justice for Refugees SA to do this work, giving voice to community concerns directly to our political decision makers, building a foundation for long-term engagement with elected MPs and senators post-election. 22 May: Beatification of Pauline Jaricot

The beatification of Pauline Jaricot, founder of the Propagation of the Faith Society, will take place on 22 May 2022. It is 400 years since the establishment of the Congregation for the Evangelisation of Peoples, 200 years since the founding of the Propagation of the Faith Society, and 100 years since the work of Catholic Mission was granted Pontifical status. Pauline Jaricot created a movement that made enormous change in the world. This was done simply, by asking people to give a penny when they gathered in their small groups (a penny in the early 1800s is probably equivalent to the cost of a cappuccino today). Donations were sent to foreign places to serve the poor of her time. This year's Propagation of the Faith appeal will be held on Sunday 22nd May in all churches of our Parish.

16th May marks the 25th anniversary of the death of Fr. Hugh O'Sullivan, Adelaide priest and chaplain to the Australian and International Young Christian Workers movement. Fr. From June 1977, he served as part time YCW national chaplain, and then as full time national chaplain from 1983-1988. Fr. Hugh went to Hong Kong in 1989 as YCW chaplain to the Asia-Pacific region. COVID-19 Protocols Update: 14th April 2022

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 please follow the instructions as per SA Health in terms of contact tracing and isolating yourself as per government health protocols. <u>Please stay home</u> and do not attend church services till you have fully recovered.
- The density requirement has been updated to full capacity in all churches.
- These density requirements (full capacity) also includes funerals and weddings.
- Wearing of face-masks is not mandatory in Church but is strongly recommended by the Archbishop to do so. Please carry your own mask if you plan to wear one. This includes all religious except when delivering a sermon.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people are requested to stay home and not attend services.
- Hand sanitiser is available at church entrances.
 Kindly sanitse your hands before entering the church.
- There should be no physical contact outside one's family or household group. There should be no shaking of hands or holding hands during Mass.
- Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- No hymn books are to be passed around and congregational singing with facemasks on is now permitted.
- · Communion is given only in hands.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
 Collection plates will not be passed around but a single drop point is provided at the churches.
- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.
- Care should be taken at the dismissal and on leaving the church to avoid social contact.
- Kindly follow the instructions of the Mass Coordinators and COVID Marshals who are here to assist you.
