11 Sep: Safe Guarding Sunday

Safeguarding Sunday forms part of National Child Protection Week, a national initiative to engage members of the community in supporting families and protecting children.

The National Child Protection Week theme for 2022 is **Every child, in every community, needs a fair go. In particular, shining a light on children growing up safe and supported. Children and young people thrive when they grow up safe, connected and supported in their family, community and culture. They have the right to grow up in environments that support them according to their needs, now and into the future...** This theme is all about the importance of the 'bigger picture' in ensuring all children are kept safe from harm and risk of harm.

Safeguarding Sunday provides us with an opportunity to celebrate the presence of children and young people in our Archdiocese and parishes, as we continue to encourage our community to be a safe environment for all.

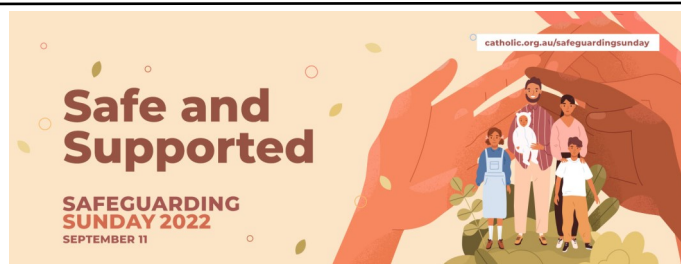
Leaders who run activities/groups for children will be invited to participate in an online survey to provide feedback on how they are encouraging children and young people to have a voice and say in their parishes and communities. Receiving this feedback will assist to inform and implement safeguarding initiatives throughout the Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide.

To hear the voices of our children and young people in the Church, they will be invited to provide feedback. Children (7-12 years of age) can complete an activity booklet and young people (13-18 years of age) can complete a short online survey accessed via a QR code below.

Children attending weekend Mass on Safeguarding Sunday will be gifted a fridge magnet with an image of a colourful cross containing a message to young people from Pope Francis encouraging them to "make your voices heard!"

18 Sep: Catholic Charities Appeal

September is Catholic Charities Month. Charity is at the heart of Living Catholic. The Catholic Charities Appeal was founded in 1941 by Archbishop Beovich to help people in our community. Originally the Appeal was established to support the four orphanages in the Diocese. As social circumstances changed the large orphanages were closed and children were cared for in family-type homes. This led to an increase in the number of Catholic welfare agencies providing for the different needs of children and families. A call for increased giving to the Catholic Diocesan Charities Appeal was made. Archbishop Gleeson was then able to include these other agencies in the Appeal. Catholic Charities is your umbrella organisation that supports the following agencies working with the most vulnerable in South Australia: Hutt St. Centre, Aboriginal Catholic Ministry, Our Lady of La Vang & St. Patrick's Special Schools, Centacare Catholic Family Services. The Annual Catholic Charities Appeal will take place in our Parish on 18 September. Kindly donate generously to this noble cause and help our fellow South Australians. A special collection will be held on 18th September in our Parish to support Catholic Charities.

25 Sep: Migrant and Refugee Sunday

The theme of the 108th World Day of Migrants and Refugees is, '*Building a Better Future with Migrants and Refugees*'.

COVID-19 Protocols Update: 17 June 2022

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 please follow the instructions as per SA Health in terms of contact tracing and isolating yourself as per government health protocols. Please stay home and do not attend church services till you have fully recovered.
- The density requirement has been updated to full capacity in all churches and also includes funerals and weddings.
- Wearing of face-masks is not mandatory in Church but is strongly recommended by the Archbishop. Please carry your own mask if you plan to wear one. This includes all religious except when delivering a sermon.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people are requested to stay home and not attend services.
- Hand sanitiser is available at church entrances. Kindly sanitise your hands before entering the church.
- Communion is given only in hands.
- Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- Procession of gifts has resumed.
- Collection plates are to be passed around with minimum contact.
- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.
