18 Sep: Catholic Charities Appeal

September is Catholic Charities Month. Charity is at the heart of Living Catholic. The Catholic Charities Appeal was founded in 1941 by Archbishop Beovich to help people in our community. Originally the Appeal was established to support the four orphanages in the Diocese. As social circumstances changed the large orphanages were closed and children were cared for in family-type homes. This led to an increase in the number of Catholic welfare agencies providing for the different needs of children and families. A call for increased giving to the Catholic Diocesan Charities Appeal was made. Archbishop Gleeson was then able to include these other agencies in the Appeal. Catholic Charities is your umbrella organisation that supports the following agencies working with the most vulnerable in South Australia: Hutt St. Centre, Aboriginal Catholic Ministry, Our Lady of La Vang & St. Patrick's Special Schools, Centacare Catholic Family Services. 22 Sep: National Day of Mourning Memorial Mass for Queen Elizabeth II

Renovations at St. Peter Claver Church

Renovations to the two toilets is now completed. The structural changes were the ground level floor and the wider doors, this work together with new fixtures and fittings creates a bright clean look which is better ventilated and much more accessible for those with mobility issues. A new electronic sign faces Stuart Road through the new glass windows. The increased light from both the western and southern entrances to the Church creates a welcome openness.

The sound system has been replaced and enhanced with a data projector and screen. The 11 red chairs with arm rests have been reupholstered in an almond colour. Further work is to be carried out on the storm water system and the creation of a kitchenette in the western store room. All this work has been made possible by the generous bequest of Marie Beveridge, late of Osmond Terrace, Norwood.

COVID-19 Protocols Update: 17 June 2022

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 please follow the instructions as per SA Health in terms of contact tracing and isolating yourself as per government health protocols. <u>Please stay home</u> and do not attend church services till you have fully recovered.
- The density requirement has been updated to full capacity in all churches and also includes funerals and weddings.
- Wearing of face-masks is not mandatory in Church but is strongly recommended by the Archbishop. Please carry your own mask if you plan to wear one. This includes all religious except when delivering a sermon.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people are requested to stay home and not attend services.
- Hand sanitiser is available at church entrances. Kindly sanitse your hands before entering the church.
- Communion is given only in hands.
- Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- · Procession of gifts has resumed.
- Collection plates are to be passed around with minimum contact.
- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.
