COVID-19 Protocols Update: 17 June 2022

- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 please follow the instructions as per SA Health in terms of contact tracing and isolating yourself as per government health protocols. <u>Please stay home</u> and do not attend church services till you have fully recovered.
- The density requirement has been updated to full capacity in all churches and also includes funerals and weddings.
- Wearing of face-masks is not mandatory in Church but is strongly recommended by the Archbishop. Please carry your own mask if you plan to wear one. This includes all religious except when delivering a sermon.
- Sick and high risk/vulnerable people are requested to stay home and not attend services.
- Hand sanitiser is available at church entrances. Kindly sanitse your hands before entering the church.
- Communion is given only in hands and Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- Holy Water is not available at the doors of churches.
- Procession of gifts has resumed.
- Collection plates are to be passed around with minimum contact.
- All surfaces should be cleaned at least daily, with special attention given to frequently touched surfaces.

SAFETY NOTICE: Cathedral Car Park and Staircase Driveway on the Cathedral lawns and Driveway in the Underground Car park

Using the carpark ramp as a pedestrian walkway or for baby strollers is a major safety hazard. Please avoid doing so.

<u>Please do not double park your car in the</u> <u>underground car park driveway blocking the safe</u> <u>entry and exit of vehicles</u> It has been brought to our attention that vehicles are being double parked in the underground car park during Weekend Masses and is a major safety hazard. Parking on the driveway of the Cathedral lawns is also prohibited at all times.

Both the driveways (underground car park and on the lawns) must be free for movement of vehicles at all times. If the underground car park is full, please exit the car park and use street car parking that is available in the adjacent street.

There is only one parking spot for Handicap Parking that is available on a first come first serve basis.
