The people of Palestine were familiar with vine growing. That is why Jesus uses the vine as imagery to teach some important lessons in today's gospel passage. Jesus talks about his relationship with his Father and his disciples using the imagery of the vine and its branches. He compares himself with a vine plant and his Father as the one who takes care of this plant. He also teaches on the absolute need for any disciple to abide in him just like a branch that abides in the vine. It is only then the disciple can produce fruits like the branches of the vine. As disciples of Jesus, we are invited to abide in him, to be part of him and to produce fruits in abundance. Am I a branch that is cut off or a branch in need of pruning? Do I produce fruits as expected of a disciple?

REMINDER NOTICE Working with Children Check Clearance for all Volunteers of the Adelaide Cathedral Parish

It is a legal requirements that all volunteers 14 years and older have a valid Working with Children Check clearance (WWCC) from the Department of Human Services (DHS). Kindly note the following:

- All new applications need to contact their local church representative to lodge their application. Please note the contact details below.
- All existing volunteers that need to renew their clearance can contact the parish office or their local representative to renew your application. Please note: DHS is directly emailing existing clearance holders 9 months prior to expiry requesting a renewal of your clearance.
- All children between the ages of 14-17 years need to apply for a WWCC with signed parental consent on the forms.
- Any volunteer (new or existing) having a valid WWCC clearance associated with another organisation can share a copy of the clearance email from DHS. Please email the details to the parish office to have it associated with the Archdiocese of Adelaide register.
- All altar servers, choir members, youth group core team, readers and ministers at Mass, cleaners, welcomers, bell ringers, sacristans, Legion of Mary core group and general church volunteers needs a valid WWCC to serve in their roles without any exceptions.
- If your clearance has expired you need to first have your clearance renewed before you continue with your ministry.
