



Fourth Sunday of Easter

This middle Sunday of Easter season is traditionally celebrated as Good Shepherd Sunday. We lift up that particular image of Jesus and the way of thinking about God's care for us. We hear the deeply comforting words of Psalm 23. We are reminded that Jesus not only protects us in our darkest hour but that He freely laid down His life for us. What greater love can be imagined isn't it?

This image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd is one that is well known and so it should be. When we think of Him in this image it brings to our minds all kinds of images which recall the ways in which our Lord cares for us. As stated in Psalm 23, God Himself is depicted in lovely ways as the shepherd of His people. Perhaps most significantly are the promises which God makes through His prophets that, since no one else is worthy or able to assume the responsibility, He will Himself come and be His people's shepherd. In His care, people will be safe, and they will be contented.

Whether we think of the image of the Good Shepherd or not, whether we like it or not, we are shepherds too. We lead other people to verdant pastures. As a priest, parent, teacher, relative, friend or companion we influence people for the better future. Even a little child is a shepherd for his/her parents. Many parents have looked at their children's eyes and have seen a trust which prevented them from going astray.

We pray that we may listen to the voice of Jesus as He calls, that we may enter the sheepfold through Him and be safe and have life and live it to the fullest.

Jesus you are the Good Shepherd who is always mindful of your Church.

To ensure we hear the voices of children and have the necessary skills to identify and respond appropriately, we invite any volunteers who have not yet participated in Child Safe Environments training or an equivalent course to attend a 90-minute Volunteer Briefing session facilitated by the Archdiocesan Child Protection Unit.

A Volunteer Briefing will be held in our Parish on Tuesday 30th April 6.30 pm- 8.00 pm in the Cathedral Hall.

If you have attended a Child Safe Environments or RRHAN training within the past 3 years you do not need to attend a Volunteer Briefing.

Please note: This briefing is for volunteers who do not have a direct role with children.

The content of the session is not suitable for children and young people (under 18 years old) to attend so please make alternative care arrangements for your children before attending a Volunteer Briefing.

REMINDER NOTICE TO ALL PARISHIONERS:

Cathedral Car Park and Staircase Driveway on the Cathedral lawns and Driveway in the Underground Car park

This is a REMINDER NOTICE to all parishioners and visitors when using the underground carpark. All pedestrians and parents with baby strollers must **ONLY USE** the carpark staircase when entering and exiting the underground carpark. Using the carpark ramp as a pedestrian walkway or for baby strollers is a major safety hazard. Please avoid doing so.

Please do not double park your car in the underground car park driveway. Blocking the safe entry and exit of vehicles during Weekend Masses and is a major safety hazard and the vehicle will be towed away at the owner's cost.

Parking on the driveway of the Cathedral lawns is also prohibited at all times. Both the driveways underground car park and on the lawns) must be free for movement of vehicles at all times.

The car park is under video surveillance at all times to check for unauthorized parking of vehicles.

REMINDER NOTICE Working with Children Check Clearance for all Volunteers of the Adelaide Cathedral Parish

It is a legal requirements that all volunteers 14 years and older have a valid Working with Children Check clearance (WWCC) from the Department of Human Services (DHS). Kindly note the following:

- All new applications need to contact their local church representative to lodge their application. Please note the contact details below.
- All existing volunteers that need to renew their clearance can contact the parish office or their local representative to renew your application. Please note: DHS is directly emailing existing clearance holders 9 months prior to expiry requesting a renewal of your clearance.
- All children between the ages of 14-17 years need to apply for a WWCC with signed parental consent on the forms.
- Any volunteer (new or existing) having a valid WWCC clearance associated with another organisation can share a copy of the clearance email from DHS. Please email the details to the parish office to have it associated with the Archdiocese of Adelaide register.
- All altar servers, choir members, youth group core team, readers and ministers at Mass, cleaners, welcomers, bell ringers, sacristans, Legion of Mary core group and general church volunteers needs a valid WWCC to serve in their roles without any exceptions.
- If your clearance has expired you need to first have your clearance renewed before you continue with your ministry.
