Sunday Reflection

A reflection on the Gospel according to
St. Mark 10:35-45.

Jesus had given his Apostles the third passion prediction leading to his death that awaited him in Jerusalem. These predictions, though repeated three times, fell on deaf ears. Two of his Apostles, James and John, came forward to ask him for the principal positions in the glorious kingdom they were sure he was going to set up once in Jerusalem. They expected an earthly political Messiah that Jesus was not. They had not grasped the meaning of his kingdom as a spiritual Messiah.

Jesus was gentle with them and challenged them by asking a question about drinking his chalice, which is participating in his suffering. He told them that if they would have a place in his kingdom, they must imitate the sacrifice he was about to make to establish that kingdom. According to Jesus, the path to glory was through suffering.

Jesus is to be **humbled** through his suffering, but James and John are asking to be **exalted!** This is a prayer that is selfish. Sometimes our own prayers can have a lot of "selfishness" in them, even when they are meant for others. We need to learn to pray as Jesus prays.

Jesus' response to James and John finds an echo to his own prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Abba, Father, for you all things are possible, remove this cup from me; yet not what I want, but what you want." (Mark 14:36). It is a prayer that submits to the will of God.

Jesus is asking us what he is able to do himself. Our prayers should be in conformity with the will of God. Jesus is asking us today that if we want to commit ourselves to his humble-servant way, even if it means the way of the cross, the way of self-sacrifice and self-denial, we should remain firm to do the will of God.

Willingness to serve others is the best way to greatness. Selfless service to others is the missionary spirit required of us. Those who follow Jesus are challenged to give themselves, their talents and time to the service of others without seeking any earthly reward. Leaders in his kingdom would not lord it over others but be servants of all.

The focus project this year is Mongolia, House of Mercy, with the Pope opening the centre in 2023. On a quiet night, Chuluunbaatar stands guard at a warehouse. It's early in winter, but the chill at night creeps in gently. The shift was routine until he learned that a car had crashed and fallen into freezing waters. His instinct was to help, but as he went to reach for a towrope, his life changed forever. "I was trying to get the tow rope from the top of a two-storey container. But one of the tow ropes pulled me down, and one of the five teeth of the other towrope fell into my leg."

Chuluunbaatar's right leg was broken, and after the incident, he would face over a year in hospital. The severity of the injury has left him with ongoing pain. Unable to work to support himself Chuluunbaatar's future crumbled. **In his time of need, Chuluunbaatar turned to the House of Mercy, located in Mongolia's capital Ulaanbaatar. The House of Mercy provides a sanctuary for people with a variety of needs; people without a place to call home, people fleeing domestic violence, people in need of a warm meal or a bed. Chuluunbaatar is one of the many who rely on the services provided.**

Today, the House of Mercy needs material support in order to continue supporting the patrons who use its service. With limited social services available elsewhere, this House provides not just shelter and food, but access to basic medical care, showers and laundry, and counselling.
