Sunday Reflection

Simon, do you love me?

Easter tide. This time is about our preparation for the proclamation of Gospel beyond Pentecost. It is the time for the Church to “ponder these things in Her heart”, that is, the things of Easter, as Mary did, so that we can share them in word and action with all we meet. At the heart of all we will proclaim is the love of God shown in Jesus’ coming to save us in his life death and resurrection. Only in the power of the Holy Spirit can we, the Church, ever hope to do this.

This love is how Jesus finally confronts Peter with his failure. It is an extraordinary moment as Peter is made to face up to his sin. Yet Jesus doesn’t confront Peter to belittle and destroy him. Rather, he does this to properly heal Peter. Peter’s denial of Jesus has until this point lingered in the face of the Resurrection. Instead of having to live for the rest of his life with the awful embarrassment of his cowardice, now Peter has to live with it in the presence of the one he denied. And everyone knows it.

In this moment in the Gospel Peter does what we all at some point try to do. He in his frustration goes back to what used to work. Before all the “Jesus stuff” Peter was a master fisherman and was one of those whose fish were exported as far as Rome. His and other families fished the lake as serious business people, hence, “I’m going fishing”. He tries to go back to something he knows. But it doesn’t work.

What Peter is about to discover is that God never lets us go back. As a recent saying I found says, ‘Don’t look back, we’re not going in that direction’. The Holy Spirit ever moves us forward, leading us to repent, be healed and slowly but surely become like Jesus, our risen Lord. In the power of the Holy Spirit, through Jesus Christ our Lord, we are coming home to the Father, and along the way we will have work to do as disciples.


This is finally the moment when Peter and the other truly leave their boats behind. Peter is about to become the first Pope and he and the other Apostles will begin the journey of the Gospel across the ages to us here sitting in the pews reading this. As we ponder these things too, as Jesus asks us again about our love for him, the journey of the Gospel continues.

May the Holy Spirit help us as disciples under construction to keep saying yes as Peter and the others had to do. The love of the Lord needs to keep spreading this year so we like Peter have work to do.

Questions of Divorce and Remarriage: Interdiocesan Tribunal of Adelaide

In 2015, Pope Francis wrote "charity and mercy demand that the Church, like a good mother, be near her children who feel themselves estranged from her." The Interdiocesan Tribunal of Adelaide is a service of the Church to assist with the pastoral care of Catholics and non-Catholics who are civilly divorced, and who are seeking to remarry or who want clarification of their standing in the Church. The Tribunal also assists remarried persons seeking to have their current marriage recognised in the Church, as well as remarried persons wishing to be baptised or received in the Catholic Church. Any divorced person, or a divorced and remarried person is welcome to contact the Adelaide office of the Tribunal to obtain further information, or to have their status within the Church clarified. Cathedral Car Park and Staircase Driveway on the Cathedral lawns and Driveway in the Underground Car park

All pedestrians and parents with baby strollers must use **ONLY** the carpark staircase when entering and exiting the underground carpark. Using the carpark ramp as a pedestrian walkway or for baby strollers is a major safety hazard. Please avoid doing so.

Please do not double park your vehicle in the underground car park driveway. Blocking the safe entry and exit of vehicles during Weekend Masses and is a major safety hazard. Parking on the driveway of the Cathedral lawns is also prohibited at all times. **Both offences will result in a fine of \$400.**

Both driveways (underground car park and on the lawns) must be free for movement of vehicles at all times. **Please note that the Cathedral lawns and underground car park are monitored by cameras at all times. Thank you for your cooperation.**
