Ascension of the Lord - Year C

1st June 2025

Sunday Reflection

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of The Lord.

Those of you of a more mature age than I would recall celebrating this on the Thursday before the Seventh week of Easter, our friends at Holy Name in the Tridentine Mass still celebrate Ascension on its actual day.

In the Novus Ordo Mass here in Australia it takes place of the Seventh Sunday of Easter. The Australian Bishop's a number of years ago made this decision to allow people who work to celebrate this great Solemnity.

Saint Luke concludes his gospel with an account of Jesus is Ascension into heaven in which he elegantly presents Jesus the Messiah as *priest*, *prophet*, *and king*. Moreover, as Lord, Jesus is to be worshipped. In the Acts of the Apostles Luke specifically says that the ascension took place forty days after the resurrection.

Two themes worthwhile reflecting on in the account that Luke offers us. Firstly Jesus led his disciples out of Jerusalem.

At his transfiguration, Jesus had discussed with Moses and Elijah his own exodus from Jerusalem. As a prophet like Moses, Jesus now completes his exodus from Jerusalem to heaven. Moreover as a prophet like Elijah, Jesus is taken up to heaven and his followers will then receive his spirit.

The second theme worthy of reflection is the action of Jesus as he ascended into heaven. He raised his hands and blessed them. These actions are those of a priest, such as Aaron, who raised his hands over the people and blessed them, or Simeon son of Jochanan, who would raise his hands over all the congregation of Israel and the blessing of the Lord would be upon his lips.

Jesus priestly blessing of his disciples at the end of the gospel provides a frame with the gospels beginning, as it recalls the blessing of Mary and Joseph by Simeon and supplies for the missing blessing of the speechless Zachariah. After giving his blessing, Jesus parted from them and ascended into heaven.

This Sunday as we celebrate this great Solemnity of the Ascension we ought to replicate the joy and the wonder and awe of the disciples who saw this as a new beginning and were overwhelmed with great joy. The disciple's mission, our mission, is to be witnesses to Jesus spending our time praising and worshipping God.

The Tribunal also assists remarried persons seeking to have their current marriage recognised in the Church, as well as remarried persons wishing to be baptised or received in the Catholic Church. Any divorced person, or a divorced and remarried person is welcome to contact the Adelaide office of the Tribunal to obtain further information, or to have their status within the Church clarified.
