29th June 2025

Sunday Reflection

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of Ss Peter and Paul. Sunday is always reserved for the celebration of the Resurrection or other feasts of the Lord or of Our Lady, but Peter and Paul are exceptions.

This celebration is a vital one for us as disciples learning to follow Jesus, as it is about two ordinary people whom the Holy Spirit “superpowers” to do extraordinary things. Ss Peter and Paul become great examples to encourage us as the Holy Spirit empowers us to share the Gospel.

St Paul, as we know, was a Pharisee, scrupulous in the keeping of the Law. His zeal saw him persecute the Church and become judge, jury and executioner over the first Christians. He watched on and fully approved of St. Stephen’s death at the hands of the mob.

Later as a member of the Church he argued with Barnabas and grumbled at various members of the Church and was backwards in telling people what they needed to hear in no uncertain terms. In short, he was a real person. Yet, he endured dreadful persecution and suffering of all sorts, and in trusting God’s faithfulness spread the Gospel all the way to Europe and hence to ourselves today. His letters to the churches are read every day across the world, still being used by the Holy Spirit to inspire and strengthen the Church. Incredible when one thinks that he started out as the enemy of the Gospel.

St. Peter, on the other hand, was with Jesus from the beginning. He heard Jesus’ preaching and witnessed his most powerful miracles. He was the first to confess Jesus as the Christ and the first to receive the Keys of the Kingdom. ‘One this rock I will build my Church’. He promised to die with Jesus even if all the others ran away. And then, in the heat of the, he denied Jesus three times and ran away like all the rest. In short, yet another real person.

One would have thought that God would be looking for someone else to carry the Gospel to the ends of the earth, but no, like Paul, Jesus’ plans for Peter would not be thwarted. Filled with the Holy Spirit, just as Paul was, Peter began to proclaim the Resurrection, and obeying Jesus’ command to “feed the sheep”, brought the Gospel to the centre of the empire, becoming the first Bishop of Rome.

These two ordinary people show us as ordinary people ourselves that filled and sent by Holy Spirit as we are God can do, is doing, extraordinary things through us as the Church. We are spreading the Good News, we are showing Jesus’ love. We may not be able to see how all this is working in the everyday events of our world, but Peter and Paul couldn’t either.

They learned that the success is God’s business, and it continues to be so. May the Holy Spirit inspire us through these two Apostles to keep trusting God’s plan, knowing that nothing is impossible for God. Saints Peter and Paul are living proof of that.
