Sunday Reflection

We are living in a world that is growing daily further away from God. People aim to get the maximum for themselves and ignore or forget their purpose in life. The sacred scriptures constantly remind us of the loving unbroken care of God towards human persons. He created everything for us and for our well-being. His concern for human persons is incomparable. He sent his messengers constantly to look after his people. He is given to us as our Father, caretaker, and protector.

The image of God as the shepherd of his people has a long tradition in the history of God's people. Today's gospel reminds us that we are the instruments of God, and we ought to help those in need even though they are unlike us and even if we dislike them. Jesus' choice of the Samaritan as the hero of his story may have made his audience wince. Even the L awyer in the story does not use his name in his response but he only says the one who showed mercy. Jesus teaches us through the parable of the Good Samaritan that God's grace comes to us in all forms and through all kinds of people.

The basic teaching Luke draws from the parable is that any time a person is found in need is a neighbour regardless to which group he/she belongs. The example of the Samaritan is presented as a model to be followed by every person.

Parking Regulations: Cathedral Lawns and Underground Cark Park

All pedestrians and parents with baby strollers must use ONLY the carpark staircase when entering and exiting the underground carpark.
